Beginners, family groups and wheelchair users are welcome to take part in the selected courses detailed below.

Venue / Parking:

The Link Centre is a leisure centre located in west Swindon and is signposted from the B4534 and B4553. Postcode SN5 7DL Grid Reference SU119844. Parking, included disabled parking, is available in the main Link Centre car park, accessible from the B4553. If required, other parking may be available in the area. Please park sensibly and do not obstruct other users of the Link Centre or other facilities in the area. **Please car-share if possible**

The Swindon Half Marathon is also taking place on 22 Sept and a number of road closures will be enforce during the day. Drivers are recommended to approach from the west or via Junction 16 of M4, following A3102 / B4534. Further details can be found at

Public Transport:

The venue is accessible by buses 1, 1A and 19 from stops close to Swindon Rail & Bus Stations.

Terrain/Hazards:

The area is a mixture of residential and commercial developments with some open parkland.

Busy roads should only be crossed at marked points.

Maps:

A3 landscape 1:5000 scale. Contours at 5m intervals.

Times:

Registration from 10.30-12:30. Start Times 11.00-1300. Courses close at 14:30.

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All course distances quoted are straight line distances and the actual distance covered may be up to 40% longer.

*Courses 6 and 7 are suitable for beginners, family groups and unaccompanied runners under 16.

**Course 8 is specifically designed for those who are in wheelchairs, either self-propelled or pushed, or those with limited mobility. The start is 400m from registration. The course can either be followed like all other courses using an Emit tag which will require the ability to access the control sites or by using the MapRun application which will automatically detect your arrival at each control. You will need to have downloaded the application onto your phone beforehand. In either circumstance you will be provided with a paper copy of the map so will not need to rely on the phone to view and follow the map. All other controls will be standard kite and emit units.

Punching: EMIT. Card hire fee £1.50 per competitor. Lost card charge £47.

Start & Finish: There will be 2 start locations. The start for courses 1-5 is about 150m walk from the Link Centre. The start for courses 6-8 is about 400m. There will be a punching start. You will not be

allocated a start time – you may go when you are ready. The finish is 400m from the Link Centre.

All competitors must report download to download, regardless as to whether they complete their

course or not.

Registration: Registration will be on the first floor of the Link Centre. Enter through the main entrance and

follow past the main reception desk to the stairs and lift. Registration will deal with any

enquiries, late entries, entry on the day and issue of hired EMIT cards.

Entries & Fees: Individual Seniors (courses 1 to 5) £10 Individual Seniors (courses 6 to 8) £5

Family Groups (courses 6 to 8) £5 Individual Juniors and Students (all courses) £3

Pre entry available online via <u>www.fabian4.co.uk</u> up to midnight 18 September. Entry for beginners, family groups and wheelchair users recommended via email to <u>poc@northwilts.org.uk</u>

before Monday 16 September.

Late entries and entry on the day (EOD) will be accepted up to the limit of available maps. To reserve a map after the pre-entry closing date please contact the Organiser (details below) before

9pm on Friday 20 September.

Facilities: Toilets, including disabled, facilities and café are available in the Link Centre. Please note there

are no changing facilities available and the café accepts card payments only. First Aid kit and

welfare facilities will be available at registration.

Safety: All competitors must complete a registration form and report to registration before starting. This

is particularly important for Wheelchair entries to ensure any helper details are recorded. Car keys may be left at registration and those travelling alone <u>must</u> leave their car keys at registration. All competitors MUST download even if they do not complete the course. The nearest A & E Hospital is at Swindon Great Western Hospital SN3 6BB. Cagoules may be made compulsory in

adverse weather.

Dogs: Dogs permitted under control in the car park. Guide and assistance dogs only are permitted in the

registration area.

Results: Results will be linked on the NWO website as soon as practical after the event.
